•09:30 AM Transfer to Rabat, enjoy a short tour of Rabat. Take a short walk of the **Mohammed V Mausoleum** where Mosaics rise from the marble floor to a ceiling of gold leaf and hand-carved cedar wood, where the three ground-floor tombs are carved from white onyx.

•11:00 AM Next to the Mausoleum is **Le Tour Hassan** (the Hassan Tower), which is the towering minaret of the Hassan Mosque, which began construction in 1195.

•11:30 AM The morning ends with a visit to the **Kasbah of the Udayas**, Rabat`s medina. This is the fortification constructed on a mountain, overlooking the ocean. The Kasbah was constructed during the realm of the Almohads. Inside the Kasbah one can come across Andalusian gardens full of orange trees, flowers and palms.

•09:30 AM Board our motor coach for City tour of Fes which is the most monumental of the Imperial Cities. The medina of Fes el-Bali (Old Fez), a World Heritage site, is the city's great draw card. It's an assault on the senses, a warren of narrow lanes and covered bazaars bursting with aromatic food stands, craft workshops, mosques and an endless parade of people. We will walk along narrow, uneven alleyways, with daylight filtering down from above high gray walls, flanked by tables heaped with spices, dried fruits, fresh fish or silk and leather garments

DAY 4 Wednesday April 17th ,2024 Fes City Tour



•12:30 PM Lunch at local restaurant.

•01:30 PM The City tour will include **Bab Boujloud**, **Mellah**, **Jamaa Al-Karaouine** the oldest continually operating university in the world. Founded in 859, virtually every surface of its quiet inner courtyard is decorated with highly detailed, delicately carved geometric patterns.. The Medersa Bouanania complex is the spiritual heart of Fez & Morocco. The Chaouwara tanneries are the city`s most iconic sights (and smells), offering a unique window into the pungent, natural process of producing world-class leather by methods that have changed little since medieval times.

•03:00 PM Time permitting, we will also **visit clay** workshops, artisan quarters, the souks of largest and oldest medina in Morocco and Batha Museum (a former Royal Palace converted into a museum in 1916 with over 6,000 collections).

•07:00 PM Dinner at our hotel.

DAY 5: Thu - Apr 18, 2024 - Fes, Volubilis, Meknes, Fes

•8:30 AM Breakfast at our hotel

•09:30 AM depart hotel via motor coach for drive to the ancient **Roman city of Volubilis** to explore its stunning ruins. Impressive stone arches and columns, Only about half of the 40-hectare UNESCO site at Volubilis has been excavated. floors of what were once family dwellings are still covered with decorative tile mosaics depicting mythological beings, such as Orpheus charming animals with his lyre and Hercules performing his legendary 12 labors. Many of these tiles are still in place and exhibiting their colors after centuries of exposure to the elements, is astonishing.

•11:00 AM visit the **whitewashed town of Moulay Idriss**, about 2 miles from Volubilis. It sits astride two green hills in a cradle of mountains, where Morocco's first Arab conquerors settled.





•12:30 PM Lunch at local restaurant

DAY 5: Thu - Apr 18, 2024 - Fes, Volubilis, Meknes, Fes

•01:30 PM Proceed to the **Imperial city of Meknes**, the one-time home of the Moroccan sultanate with its allwinding narrow streets in the medina and grand buildings that warrant it as an imperial city. Remnants of three sets of fortifications, ingeniously incorporated into the city`s road networks, emphasize its past importance & glory. The king`s tomb sits at the heart of what remains of the original imperial city, flanked by the magnificent Bab el-Mansour.

•03:00 PM Drive back to Fes

•07:00 PM Dinner at the hotel.

•Overnight in Fes.

DAY 6: Fri - Apr 19, 2024 - Fes, Casablanca (-+3H10 min)



•08:30 AM Breakfast at the hotel. Leave Fez and drive to Casablanca via highway.

1:00 PM Upon arrival, start discovering Morocco`s largest city and economic capital, Casablanca is the best representation of the modern nation.

•A brief highlight tour will cover, **Place Mohammed V**, and new public buildings include the **Grand Theatre de Casablanca**. The city`s handsome Moresque buildings, which meld French-colonial design and traditional Moroccan style, seen best downtown area, the **Quartier Habous** and **the beachside Suburb of Ain Diab**, and the flamboyant building of **Hassan II Mosque (exterior)**.

•Continue to your hotel to freshen up. The remainder of the day is at leisure to relax.

7:00 PM Late in the evening, head to **Rick`s café restaurant** for dinner.

•Overnight in Casablanca.

DAY 7: Sat - Apr 20, 2024 - Marrakech, City Tour

•08:30 AM Breakfast at the hotel <u>Savoy Legrand Hotel Marrakech</u>

•09:30 AM depart hotel for Marrakech where you will unearth the secrets of, Marrakech beginning in **the medina**, the old walled section of town and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This thousand-year-old city was long a political, economic and cultural center. Marvel at its architectural jewels, including the soaring Koutoubia minaret. Continue to **the Bahia Palace**, an exemplary specimen of privileged life in the 19th century.

•11:00 AM Your next stop is at the **Tiskiwin Museum (Maison Tiskiwin)**, which houses an impressive collection of North African arts and crafts. The museum, which was founded by a Dutch anthropologist, is organized into geographically themed exhibits, with each room focusing on artifacts from different towns and regions along the ancient trade route from Marrakech to Timbuktu. The works on display include exquisite hand-woven carpets and textiles, traditional Berber clothing and jewelry, intricate basket works and tribal handicrafts.



•12:30 PM Lunch at local restaurant.

DAY 7: Sat - Apr 20, 2024 - Marrakech, City Tour

•01:30 PM Later you will visit **Djemaa el-Fna**, Marrakech's main square, which is filled with orange juice stalls and vendors, along with fire-eaters, mime artists, snake-charmers and street musicians performing at every turn. You may also take the opportunity to explore the city's fabled, labyrinthine souks, their bustling alleyways brimming with all manner of wares.

•04:30 PM Following your visit, return to your hotel. The remainder of the day is at leisure, a perfect opportunity to freshen up and get ready for the night out.

Morocco Travel Tips

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- Know Before You Go: Although most of the planning and preparation is taken care of for you, there are still a few things you should know and some details you should take care of to ensure your comfort, safety and peace of mind. Please review the following information before your departure to ensure that any surprises along the way will only be pleasant ones.
- Passports and Visas: It is each travelers responsibility to have a passport valid for at least 6 months from the date of departure and a visa if required. Please check the information at https://www.righttravel.info/page/visa-5.html for the specific country/region you are visiting for more details. Passengers who are not U.S. citizens must check with the respective consulate or a visa agency to determine what personal identification is required. Passengers who enter, leave and then re-enter the same country on their itinerary should check if they require a double-entry visa. Passport applications are available at most U.S. Post Offices, as well as at regional Passport Agencies.
- Trip Preparation: A little pre-planning can make your trip go a lot smoother. Several weeks before your trip, make a list of what you will
 need to take with you. Make sure your personal documents (passports, visas) are in order and that you have enough prescription
 medications to last through the trip. We suggest that you make photocopies of passports, visas, and any other important travel documents
 and pack them separately from the originals. Pack a list of medications including dosage and generic names. If you lose the originals
 while traveling, youll have copies for easier reporting and replacement. We recommend that you pack a portable alarm clock.
- Making Telephone Calls from One Country to Another: When dialing a number from one country to another, you should proceed as follows: dial your countrys Exit Code + destination Country Code + Phone Number.
- For most countries, the exit code is 00. Exceptions include the USA and Canada (011), Hong Kong and Cambodia (001), Australia (0011), and Russia (8 Pause 10*). For Brazil, please consult with the local telephone company. If the international number you wish to call starts with a 0 (zero), you must this starting digit when dialing the number.

Morocco Travel Tips

Languages Morocco

- Amazigh (Berber) and Arabic are two official languages. French is taught and used universally for commerce. Spanish is spoken in some northern regions.
- Electricity: Please note: The U.S. uses 120 volts and you can purchase a converter and transformer at most hardware stores for your 120V appliances. **Morocco** The voltage used is 220 volts.
- Code of Conduct: Morocco Morocco is an Islamic country. Shaking hands is a standard form of greeting. Normal courtesies should be observed. Casual dress is acceptable, but women should take care to dress modestly. Beachwear should be confined to the beach and poolside. While freedom to practice ones religion is guaranteed and non-Muslims are not harassed, proselytizing is prohibited and even a discussion of religion in public may violate this restriction. Smoking is very common.
- Climate & Clothing: Morocco Spring and Autumn: 55&ndash75°F Summer: 65&ndash95°F Winter: 45&ndash65°F. Bring comfortable walking shoes, a sweater, clothes you can layer and an all-weather jacket. Some religious sites may require modest dress to enter (no shorts, short skirts, or sleeveless tops). In summer, bring a hat and sunscreen

- Currency: We suggest getting a small amount of currency for the first country youre visiting before you leave the U.S. It is a good idea to carry a chart with you to help you convert U.S. dollars to the local currency. Its also a good idea not to carry too much money. Many countries have ATM machines that accept most U.S. ATM cards, but be sure you know your ATM password in numbers-the keypads on foreign ATMs dont always have letters. ATM machines will only dispense cash in local currency. Check with respective consulates to learn current currency allowances and requirements. Use your credit card whenever possible. Should you decide to carry cash or travelers checks, exchange them at banks where the rate is more favorable than at hotels or exchange bureaus. Please note that many banks and most vendors will not accept or exchange \$100 bills. We suggest to carry \$20 bills or smaller.

Morocco Travel Tips

• **Gratuities:** This is a matter of personal discretion. You may use the following as a guideline:

Suggested Tipping

- Tour escort (Coordinator): \$6 or \$7 per person per day
- Driver (Provides chauffeur services and limited assistance with luggage) : \$5 per person per day
- Private tours: \$10 to \$12 per person per day for each day of sightseeing
- Suggested Tipping: Hotels
- Porter: \$1.00 per bag per person
- Wait staff: \$1.50 per person (lunch or dinner)
- Chamber maid: \$1.00 per person per day
- Tipping is considered by many locals to be a part of their normal remuneration, and some may approach you for additional compensation. There is no need to be intimidated by the request, nor should you feel pressured to pay more than recommended. If you become uncomfortable by any behavior you encounter, please advise your tour escort or phone our local office. Numbers have been provided in your documents for your convenience.
- Morocco It is customary to tip in restaurants and other places that cater to tourists.
